Purpose of the Role

Main Responsibilities

- Actively participate in the work of EFPA Board/Standing Committee/Working Group.
- Facilitate collaboration between EFPA and EFPSA by connecting professionals and students.

Tasks

- Attend meetings of the EFPA Board/Standing Committee/Working Group.
- Fulfil the tasks assigned by the EFPA Board/Standing Committee/Working Group.
- Attend EFPSA meetings for the EFPSA Representatives in EFPA.
- Inform the EFPA group about updates in EFPSA.
- Write updates about the work of the EFPA Board/Standing Committee/Working Group.
- Present the EFPA Board/Standing Committee/Working Group at the annual EFPSA Congress.
- Promote EFPSA's opportunities within EFPA.

Requirements

- Applicant should either:
 - 1) currently hold or have held a position during the current (2021-2022) or past (2020-2021) mandate within EFPSA as a Member Representative or part of the Executive Board; or
 - 2) have held the position of the EFPSA Representative in EFPA in the previous mandate (maximum of one mandate to reapply).
- Received an EFPSA Certificate (stating that you have previously held a position within EFPSA in the previous mandate).
- Extended scientific knowledge (preferred) or great interest in the topics of the specific [Working Group](#) that holds an open position.
- Structured working style.
- Strong command of the English language.
- Proactive attitude.
- Excellent communication skills.
